- Where did this information come from?
- The information contained in BrokerCheck comes from FINRA's Central Registration Depository, or CRD® and is a combination of:
  - o information FINRA and/or the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) require brokers and brokerage firms to submit as part of the registration and licensing process, and
  - o information that regulators report regarding disciplinary actions or allegations against firms or brokers.
- How current is this information?
- Generally, active brokerage firms and brokers are required to update their professional and disciplinary information in CRD within 30 days. Under most circumstances, information reported by brokerage firms, brokers and regulators is available in BrokerCheck the next business day.

the entry of findings that he exercised discretion to purchase a total of \$208,714 of VelocityShares 3x Long Crude Oil (UWTI) in the accounts of his member firm's clients, without written permission to exercise discretion in their brokerage accounts. The findings stated that Jones caused his firm to maintain inaccurate books and records by mismarking most of the UWTI orders as unsolicited. Jones firm's policies only permitted the purchase in brokerage accounts of leveraged

exchange-traded products such as UWTI on an unsolicited basis.
